



2026 Diabetic Shoe Pricing Guide

Properly fitted diabetic shoes and inserts play an important role in preventing foot complications and maintaining overall foot health. For patients who are medically qualified, Medicare Part B generally covers 80% of the cost of one (1) pair of diabetic shoes and up to three (3) pairs of inserts per calendar year. The remaining 20% coinsurance may be covered by a secondary insurance plan if available; however, Medicaid as a secondary insurance typically does not cover this portion, which may result in an out-of-pocket cost. If you're unsure about your secondary coverage, please reach out to your insurance plan to learn more.

Eligibility for coverage is based on specific medical criteria. If you are unsure whether you qualify, we encourage you to speak with your podiatrist at your next visit to determine your eligibility and discuss the best options for your care.
